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Inspiring Story of *Kartika*

Please meet Kartika who is 23 years old and has been attending YPK in both the rehabilitation and educational programs since 2014 (9yrs) until recently. Kartika had progressed to taking part in the training organised by Dnetwork Indonesia, which is an organisation within the Annika Linden Centre that provided Kartika with training on how to establish a business.

The YPK education team registered Kartika to participate in the training because she was already independent. Training started in February 2023 for 6 months. During this time it was established that Kartika could successfully commence her business named "Dupa Kartika" (an incense business), and she obtained a starting capital of 2,000,000 rupiah from the program. She also participated in an exhibition that showcased works by people with disability with others who passed the training in July 2023. Currently, Kartika continues to produce incense at economical prices, with assistance from families in the process of packing the product.





Short Time but Big Result - Marije and Karin

YPK welcomed Marije and Karin, Occupational Therapists from PUM Experts, the Netherlands who provided training to the YPK physiotherapists for one week in mid-October. Marije and Karin provide training in the techniques of physically moving and handling clients with disabilities. They also gave training to the physiotherapists with new and innovative techniques and knowledge in assessing YPK clients. These included measuring their movement quality. Furthermore, Marije and Karin shared knowledge related to Sensory Integration Problems for Cerebral Palsy.

YPK Bali was founded in 2001 and is a not-for-profit organisation. It aims to assist people with a physical disability to be independent, to help improve their health, optimise their abilities, and to help them recognise their importance in society.

About YPK

What We Do

YPK Bali provides integrated programs for people with physical disabilities to improve their health and independence through physical rehabilitation programs, informal education, mobile clinics, and a hearing loss prevention program called BaliRungu.



Where We Work

YPK Bali is located at the Annika Linden Centre in Tophati, Bali, which is a new rehabilitation facility. The Centre is custom-built to cater for local non-profit organisations and includes YPK and other health and disability organisations. YPK Bali also reaches out to people with physical disabilities throughout Bali via our outreach program.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

In the wake of YPK experiencing 3 major disasters - The COVID pandemic 2019-2021/22; The loss of its founder Mr. Purnawan Budisetia 2022; and the death of the new YPK Director Mrs. Kadek Wahyuni Andityawati 2023, YPK Bali is beginning to return to normal. The recovery has largely been attributed to the spirit of dedication, and support from its staff, donors, partners, clients and their families.

The Board of YPK Bali has been committed to ensuring that the organisation has a leader who understands YPK programs, its values, vision and mission. As a consequence, Mrs. Elsy Suryawan, Chairperson of YPK Bali, was appointed to continue its leadership. The board viewed this decision as appropriate in view of Mrs. Elsy having been a part of YPK for 22 years and having 25 years of experience in social humanitarian activities and community development programs. The transition was successfully carried out with the support of YPK's Executive Board and their main partners - the Inspirasia Foundation and the Annika Linden Centre.

YPK Bali continues to develop the potential of its resources, and builds on the services and programs it provides, whilst collaborating with various stakeholders to ensure that their impacts will be achieved.

This year, YPK creates technological innovations in the rehabilitation unit by developing a VR (Virtual Reality) application as therapy equipment. Furthermore, selected YPK Bali disabled students are being encouraged to gain independence by being given access to entrepreneurial business management training. The aim is to help that person/s to open their own business which will offer them independence in their lives.

REHABILITATION PROGRAM

The rehabilitation unit is committed to continuing to assist people with physical disabilities and their family members. We realise that the current situation is no longer limited, and we have the potential to carry out programs and all activities as before the pandemic eg tue Multidisciplinary therapy approach, and combining physiotherapy and occupational therapy. All support is provided in collaboration with each child's parents. This program has empowered 230 people with physical disabilities (an average number per year) to access integrated rehabilitation programs.

ACHIEVEMENT OF REHABILITATION



VIRTUAL REALITY TECHNOLOGY

Virtual Reality technology commonly called VR, is no longer used in limited applications in life. Indeed, the use of this technology is increasingly being utilised in various professions and comes with many positive impacts. These include the use of technology in therapy to improve individual abilities specifically those affected by a disability.

Collaborating with Warmadewa University Denpasar, YPK Bali took part in implementing VR in Rehabilitation activities. Such an activity is where clients carry out a series of training scenarios, with a focus on tasks applied in a game approach. The results of the exercise are monitored by the YPK Physiotherapist regularly. Using VR technology, clients can exercise and have fun.

During exercises using VR, virtual reality distracts clients from focusing on their pain and provides an alternative reality that motivates and encourages users to complete the activity. It is in this way, that it's possible for clients who are recovering from a stroke or another disability to be able to practice certain movements without the risk of injury or falling. Furthermore, this exercise increases a client's confidence when they move around in their real-life environment.

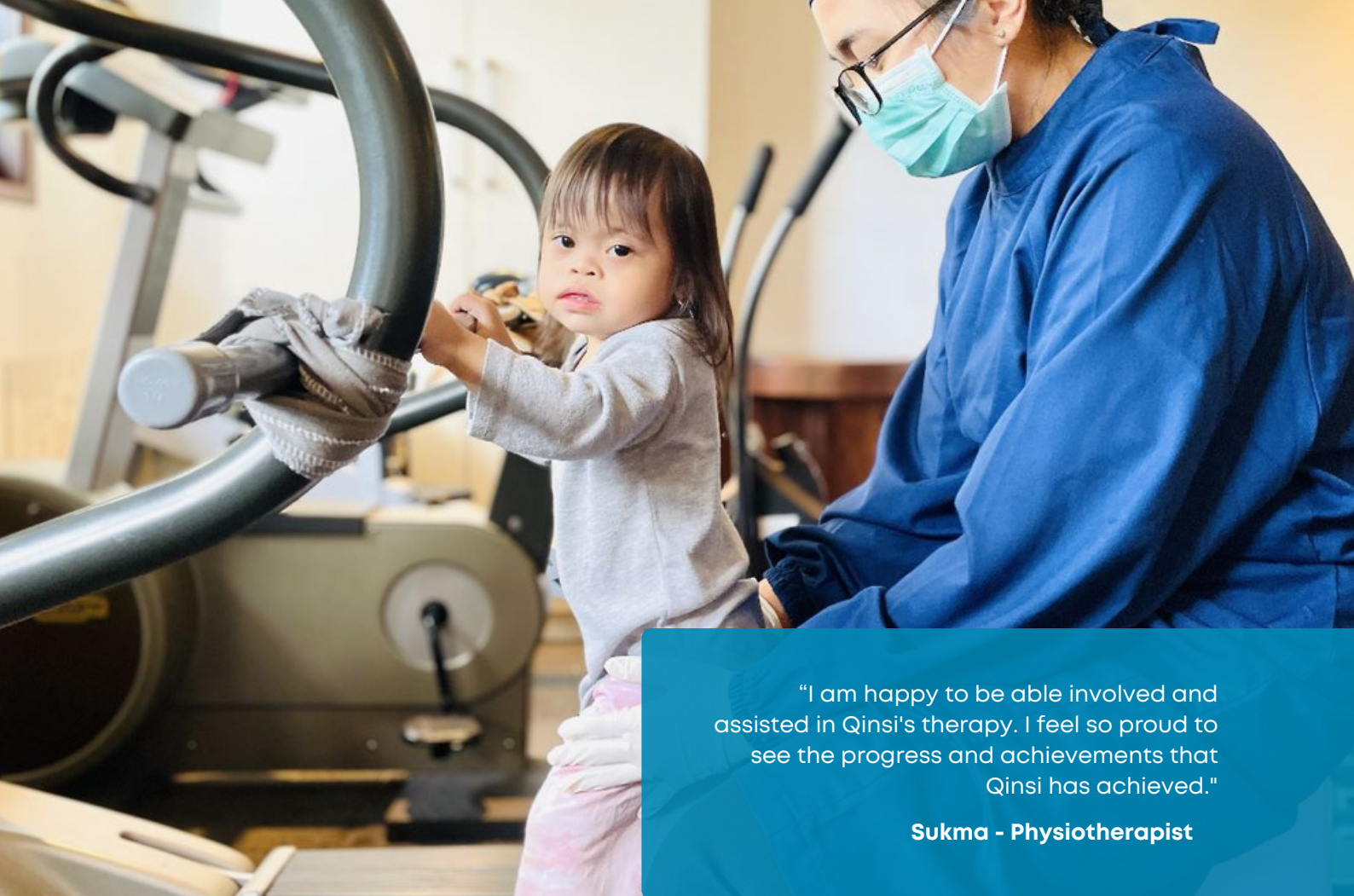

Qinsi Surpasses Her Therapy Goals

Qinsi joined the therapy program at YPK when she was only 6 months old, and she is now 3 years old. She had a condition of weak muscle tone and was unable to roll over. Therapy at YPK provided a lot of positive progress. A supportive, beautiful environment and complete therapy tools are some of the plus points for Qinsi's therapy at YPK.

Not only that, YPK staff and Qinsi's parents can be directly involved in the therapy process, making us more understanding and empowered to intervene from home. There is a networking group that is directly monitored by the treating therapist, making YPK feel enthusiastic about continuing to be stimulated because everyday progress will continue to be monitored even though it is not in the therapy schedule. We also had other knowledge besides physiotherapy, such as health checks and awareness through webinars to increase our insight as parents.

EDUCATION PROGRAM

The YPK Bali Education Program believes that every child has the right to equality and opportunity to access education. Since 2009 we have provided a special modified education curriculum for children with physical disabilities.

With the support of parents and family members, the YPK Education Program supports 124 students with physical disabilities to access fun, meaningful, and adventurous learning experiences. Three professional and highly skilled teachers ensure that each student has an Individual Education Plan (IEP) as a reference in learning development.

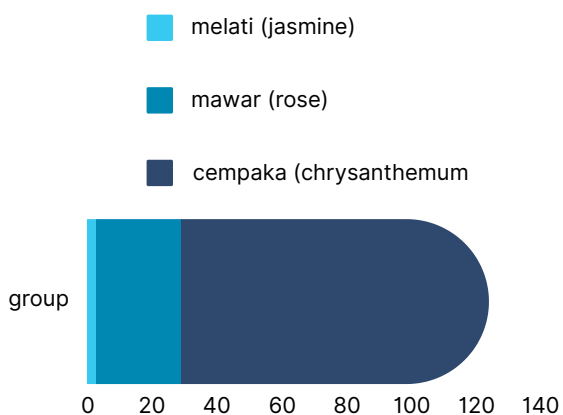

CHALLENGE & SOLUTION

Most of the students in YPK have very limited abilities in mobility, socialisation and communication. The Cempaka group requires very complex and unique learning assistance. This is quite challenging for all teachers to create learning activities that can stimulate their sensory and information.

To overcome this, teachers develop various learning activities. The team of teachers has collaborated with local volunteers and families to maximize increased student independence.

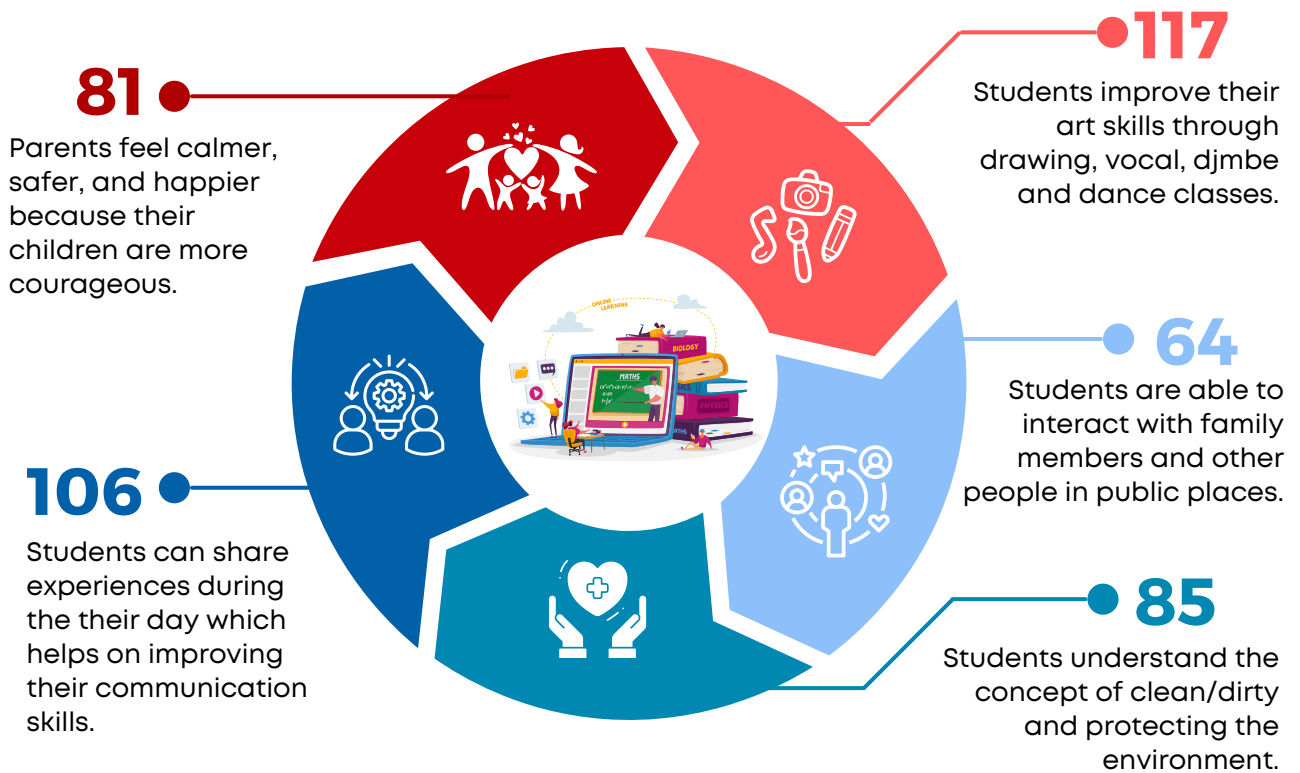

MOBILE CLINIC PROGRAM

The Mobile Clinic Program has successfully provided services to dozens of villages in Bali. This service also introduces the wider community to the role of physical therapy/physiotherapy in the care and management of disabilities.

The provision of services carried out at the village office or Banjar Hall has also provided an opportunity for everyone to gather and support each other. Mobile Clinic service support is increasingly expanding with collaboration with local organisations to empower communities, and to increase the active role of village communities.

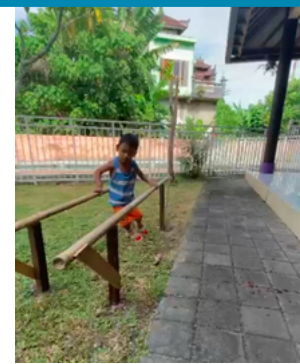

EMPOWERMENT OF CADRES IN PUTERA DESA AT SANGGULAN, TABANAN



YPK Bali developed a pilot project for Putera Desa in 2022. Putera Desa is a community-based disability center one of the efforts to approach rehabilitation and promote social engagement. Putera Desa Salam Kasih, Tabanan was launched in April 2022 in collaboration with Forum Bhinneka Tunggal Ika. The success of the Putera Desa Salam Kasih service has been felt by the people of Tabanan. From 19 clients, up to now, 30 clients can be helped to remain active in therapy with local cadres.

Training support of 5 cadres of local volunteers who have committed and are willing to help those who lack access to sustainable therapy services. The Cadre Team has been able to accompany the exercise independently and Centra Putera Desa Salam Kasih can operate twice a week service. The clinic's Mobile team continues to assist in supervising the evaluation of the client's condition. This is to ensure that therapeutic exercises are in accordance with the plan.

Success Story about Hasan



Introducing Hasan, who is a 7 years old boy and is a spastic quadriplegic cerebral palsy from the Kayubih-Bangli regency.

Hasan is one of the twin boys who were born normally, however when he was 2 yo, he experienced a decline in his condition to result in functional delays. This was caused by a history of febrile seizures at the age of 8 months. Plus being an oversensitive boy, Hasan easily cried.

Hasan was brought by his family to attend a therapy service last October at PUTERA Desa, Sanggulan-Tabanan. It was here that the YPK mobile clinic team provided passive exercise assistance, and various exercise stimulation to improve Hasan's functional abilities. These exercises include: squatting; sitting to standing; standing with and without a handle; to walking.

Hasan is classified as a toddler, and the therapy process has been quite a challenge in the therapeutic training approach. This is because Hasan often cries because of his previous trauma from medical treatment. Hasan's mother is strong and does not give up easily and remains focused on helping Hasan. The physiotherapists often ask his twin brother Hasan to join in with Hasan's therapy as an example and motivational strategy. Furthermore, the exercises extend to being practised at home, starting from exercise movements, and exercise positions, to good gripping when training.

In conjunction with the YPK team and the enthusiasm and commitment of his mother, while training at home, Hasan is now experiencing very progressive development so he can walk independently. The family's expectations have been exceeded and Hasan is more active in socialising with children, as well as receiving education and sharing with physiotherapists and other fellow clients' parents.

- Client and caregiver counselling and education about hearing loss and hearing aids

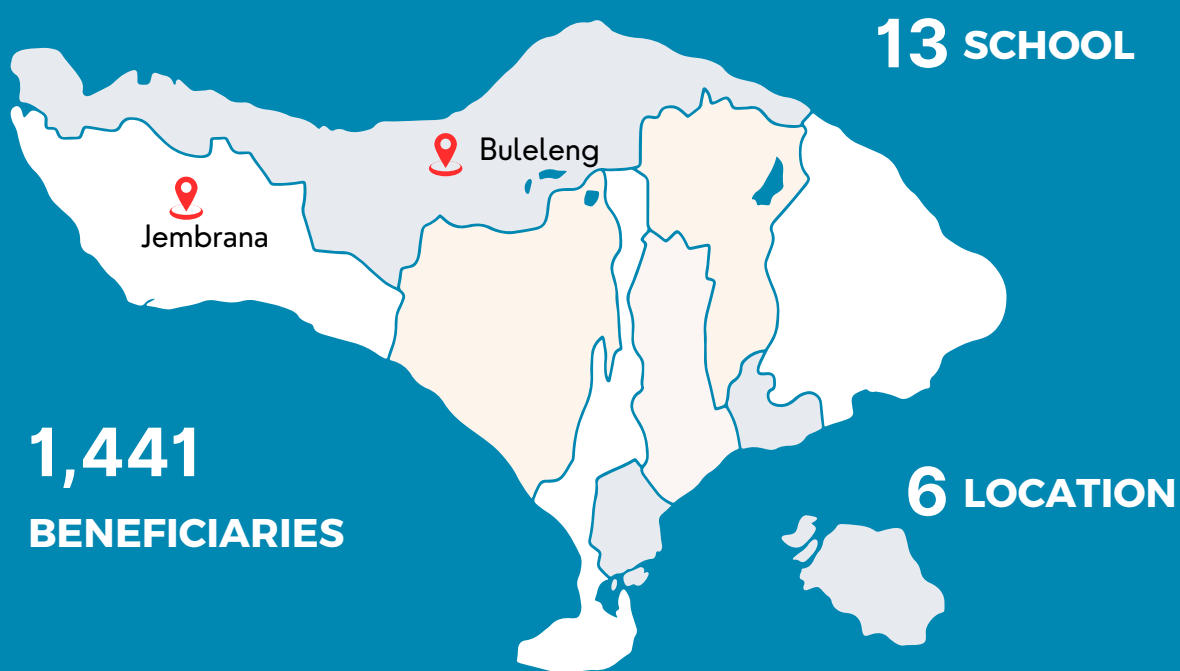


New Areas...

(Buleleng and Jembrana regency)

BaliRungu program is committed to continuing to provide health services (ENT examination and audiometer examination), promote early detection of hearing loss at an early age, and raise awareness of preventable hearing loss.

2023 is the first year BaliRungu has reached the West and North Bali regions. Through the approach and support of ENT specialists from RSUD Buleleng and Negara, BaliRungu managed to examine 1,441 children with 46% of them experiencing severe earwax buildup-cases.

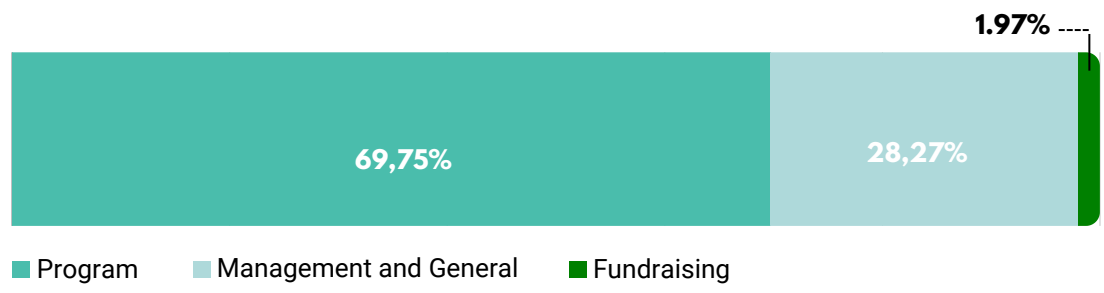
END OF YEAR STAFF ACTIVITY

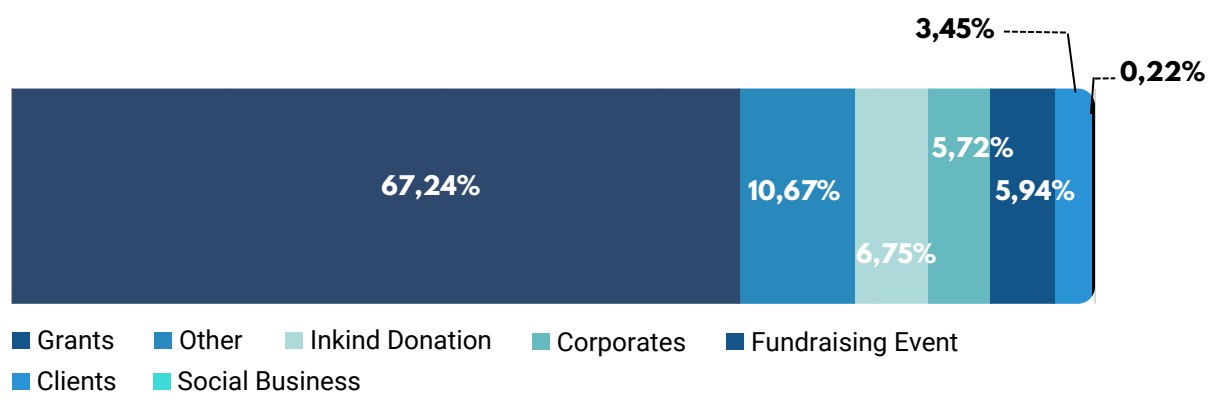

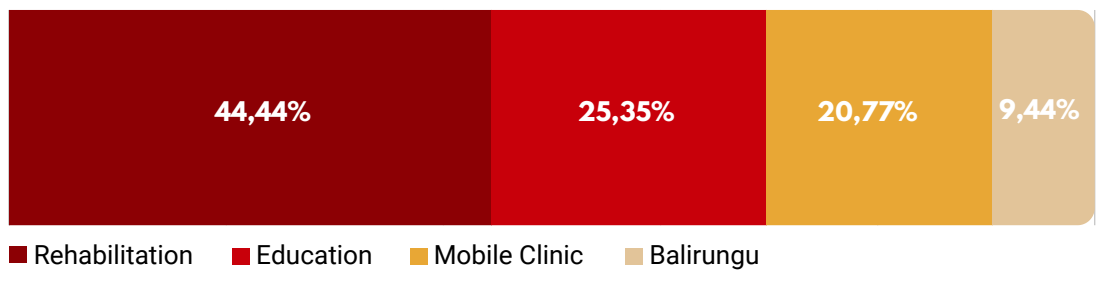
