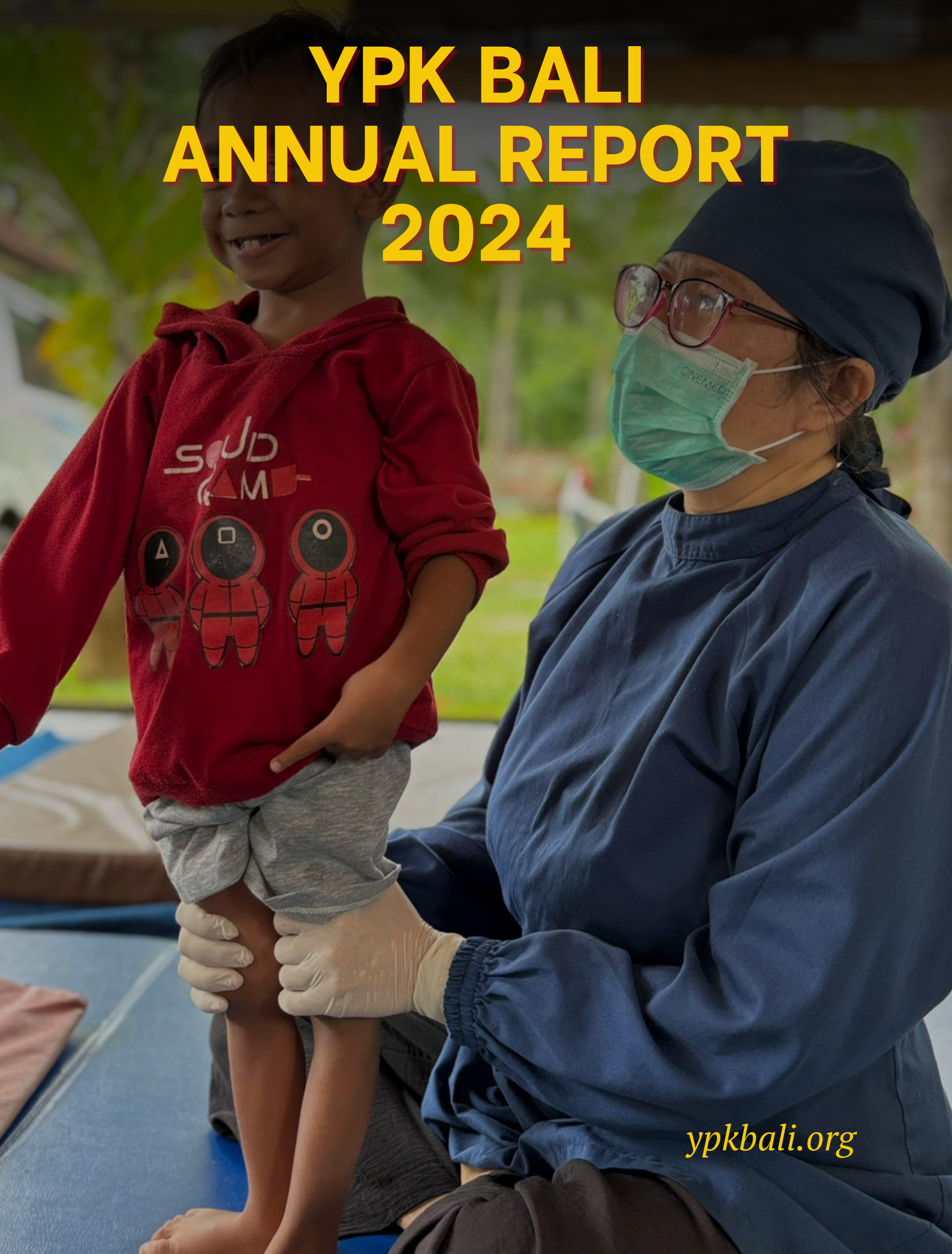

Executive Summary

The year 2024 has been a valuable period for YPK Bali, as we continued to strengthen our commitment to inclusivity, social awareness, and empowerment for persons with disabilities. Through meaningful programs and collaborations, we have not only provided essential and integrated rehabilitation and education but have also paved the way for greater societal acceptance and appreciation of their talents.

Through each process, YPK Bali continues to develop 4 main programs to serve the community. Each program that runs is expected to be able to provide better life expectancy for people with disabilities and their families. We also develop cooperation with several institutions both in Bali and also in regions in Indonesia.

One of the most profound moments of the year was the first-ever Metatah Massal ceremony for children with disabilities. This historic event broke long-standing cultural barriers, ensuring that every child, regardless of ability, could partake in this sacred Balinese rite of passage. With the warmth of community support and the spirit of tradition, the ceremony symbolised a powerful step toward a more inclusive society, where disability is no longer seen as a reason for exclusion but as part of the rich cultural fabric of Bali.

Creativity and artistic expression also took center stage in 2024. The long, gradual and persistent process of therapy and education carried out by the children fostered by YPK Bali finally produced proud results. A remarkable achievement came when paintings by children with disabilities were transformed into modern batik-style scarves and clothing by a renowned Jakarta-based designer. This collaboration did not only showcase their artistic abilities but also reinforced the message that talent knows no limits. The collection was not just a fashion statement—it was a celebration of inclusivity, proving that art has the power to connect, inspire, and redefine perceptions.

Beyond this milestone, the impact of YPK Bali has reached a new level. The existence of children with disabilities and their families is increasingly recognised; and many adult clients, many of whom are stroke survivors, are finally able to return to productive work and are accepted by their families and communities. One of our programs, the Mobile Clinic Program, continued to expand, providing crucial rehabilitation services to remote villages, ensuring that individuals with disabilities receive the care and support they deserve. Through these efforts, we have seen growing community awareness, a shift in societal attitudes, and an increasing embrace of disability inclusion as a collective responsibility.

As we close this remarkable year, we look forward to fostering even greater collaboration, advocating for stronger policies on inclusivity, and continuing to create opportunities that uplift and empower. Together, we are shaping a future where every individual, regardless of ability, is valued, included, and celebrated.

Who We Are

YPK Bali was founded in 2001 and is a not-for-profit organisation. It aims to assist people with a disability to be independent, improve their health, optimise their abilities, and help them recognise their importance in society.

What We Do

YPK Bali provides integrated programs for people with physical disabilities to improve their health and independence through physical rehabilitation programs, informal education, mobile clinics, and a hearing loss prevention program called BaliRungu.

Where We Work

YPK Bali is located at the Annika Linden Centre in Denpasar, Bali, which is a new integrated rehabilitation facility. It is custom-built to cater for local non-profit organisations, which includes YPK and other health and disability organisations. YPK Bali also reaches out to people with physical disabilities throughout Bali through our outreach program.

ACTIVITIES HIGHLIGHT

Metatah Ceremony for People with Disabilities



Metatah is a ceremony in Hinduism that aims to control the 6 vices in humans. Commemorating the 23rd anniversary of YPK (twenty-third), we hold this ceremony for disabled and general clients, especially people with disabilities. This tooth cutting activity was attended by 30 participants with disabilities, where YPK collaborated with Taman Prakerti Budaya, Gianyar which was the place where this ceremony took place.

Batik Fashion Show – AuthenTIK AstaKarya



The batik images of YPK children were selected in the Asta Karya #AunthenTIK activity initiated by Hotel Aryaduta Bali. The selected batik images were converted into digital images by designer Marselina Anggita, so that they could be produced into several products.

This collaboration work was launched right on October 19 at the Aryaduta hotel in the BeAuthenTIK–Asta Karya event and was shown live with fashion show performances by several models. Marselina ANggita's children's and designer products are on display for a month at the Aryaduta Bali Hotel and are also sold in limited editions.

ACTIVITIES HIGHLIGHT

Capacity Building from Ascend Health



Training and increasing skills and capacity for YPK staff is being provided by Ascend Health who is a bespoke registered NDIS health care provider in Western Australia, South Australia, and Queensland. They are all dedicated in setting a higher standard of health care in the community.

The training is being delivered by a team of physiotherapists and occupational therapists. Some training examples include – Communication strategies to focus on the child, eye contact, responding to every child's words, or can use toys that produce sound/sound books. These activities were carried out for one week at the Annika Linden Centre, which was attended by several foundations in Bali.

AVPN Global Conference 2024



Mrs. Elsy was selected as one of the speakers at the AVPN Global Conference which was held on 23-25 April 2024 at ST. Regis Saadiyat Island Resort & Park Hyatt Abu Dhabi Hotel and Villas.

Mrs. Elsy had the opportunity to present and explain as a leader. All the dimensions and delivered a local leadership model that can be a role model at the regional level. There were 2 themes presented by Mrs. Elsy:

1. Cross-cultural Nuances in Creating Inclusive Society for People with Disabilities.
2. South-south learning reimagined: Transforming Knowledge Sharing among Impactful Leaders.

This was an opportunity to bring the YPK name to the international stage. In addition, Mark Weingard (Founder of Inspirasia Foundation) was also present at this event.

Get back up and live life



Mrs. Eko (55) from Denpasar experienced a Non-Hemorrhagic Stroke. One morning, she suddenly experienced weakness in her right hand and leg. She was immediately taken to a hospital in Denpasar. After undergoing treatment for a week at the hospital, she came to YPK for therapy.

From the beginning of meeting her, indeed her soul is a person who never gives up and is full of determination to return to be healthy. In the first month, Mrs. Eko practised sitting up, and squatting up with YPK's physiotherapist.

In the third month, Mrs. Eko made a significant change, where she was able to stand more stably without a tripod, she could walk slowly and was able to do activities such as eating and buttoning clothes independently.

With such rapid changes, she can finally return to her profession to work as a teacher at a school in Denpasar.

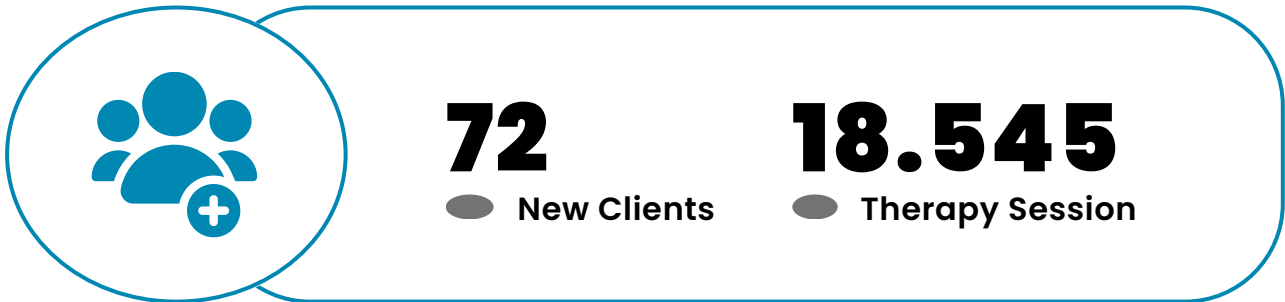

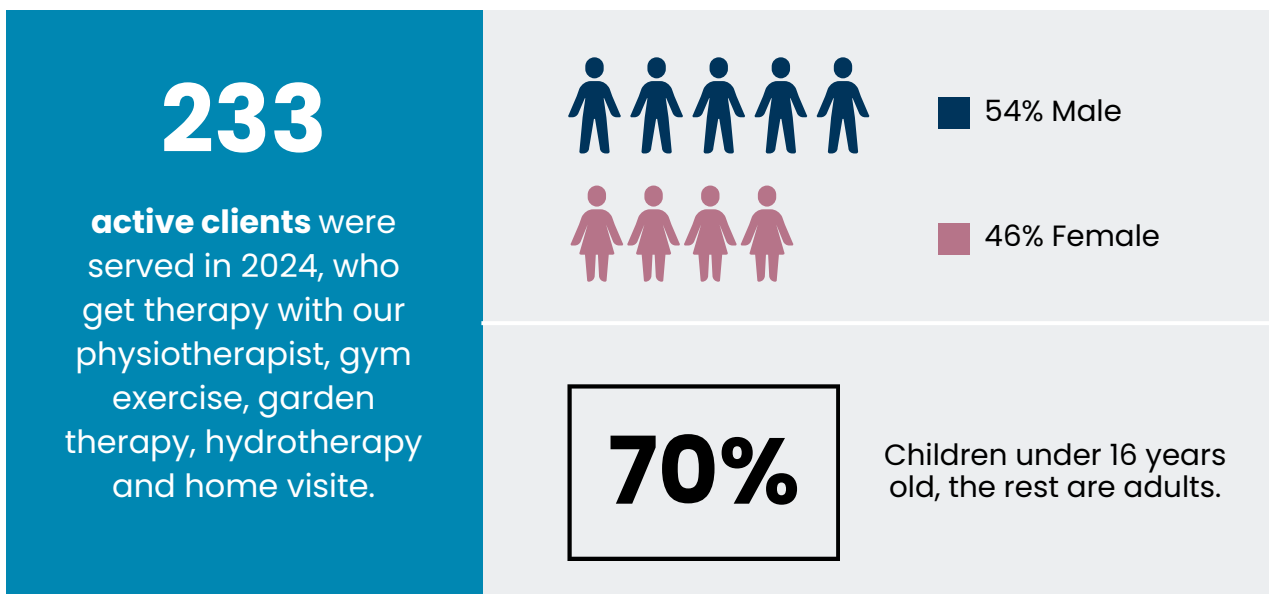
Rehabilitation Program

ACTIVITIES HIGHLIGHT



Hydrotherapy Service Enhancement

YPK's team of physiotherapists directly provides hydrotherapy services to clients every Saturday at the Denpasar City Disability Service Center Building.

Health Workshop and Seminar

In addition to providing therapy services at the service center in Denpasar, we hold workshops and seminars 3 times a year for disabled clients and parents/guardians for the implementation of a more comprehensive and effective exercise program for disability management at home.



Health Screening for Clients with Disabilities and Families

In collaboration with partners, organisations and volunteers, we provide routine health services 3 times a year for clients with disabilities. The examinations they got include; general examination, blood stool, uric acid, internal medicine, neurology, child nutrition, ophthalmology and ENT.

LOVE, PASSION, AND NEVER GIVE UP

The challenges faced by parents with children with disabilities are real and diverse. Agus (12yo) from Gianyar was diagnosed with cerebral palsy when he was 2 years old. From medical needs to the struggle to gain the necessary access and support, every step of her parent's journey is fraught with trials.

However, in the midst of all this, we see the incredible power of parental love that radiates and encourages them to transcend boundaries. Day by day, Agus began to undergo therapy at YPK for almost 9 years. Not only at YPK, every day the mother takes time to train Agus at home and every weekend Agus practices cycling with his mother and sister around his house.

With the relentless support from his parents, finally, Agus slowly began to have significant changes. Now Agus can be more independent in activities like other people, such as bathing and eating independently. Access to move can also be done by Agus from a wheelchair and also standing with the help of a walker. His mother was also able to return to work and feel more calm leaving Agus at YPK or at school because of his independence.

Family Fun Day

The event is held once at the end of the year. This activity is an educational children's event to display their interests and talents and collaborate with their parents and students graduating from the Education program.



Educational Visit

Swimming classes with a professional coach are held once a week to hone the skills of 10 (ten) children towards the Paralympic Sport competition.

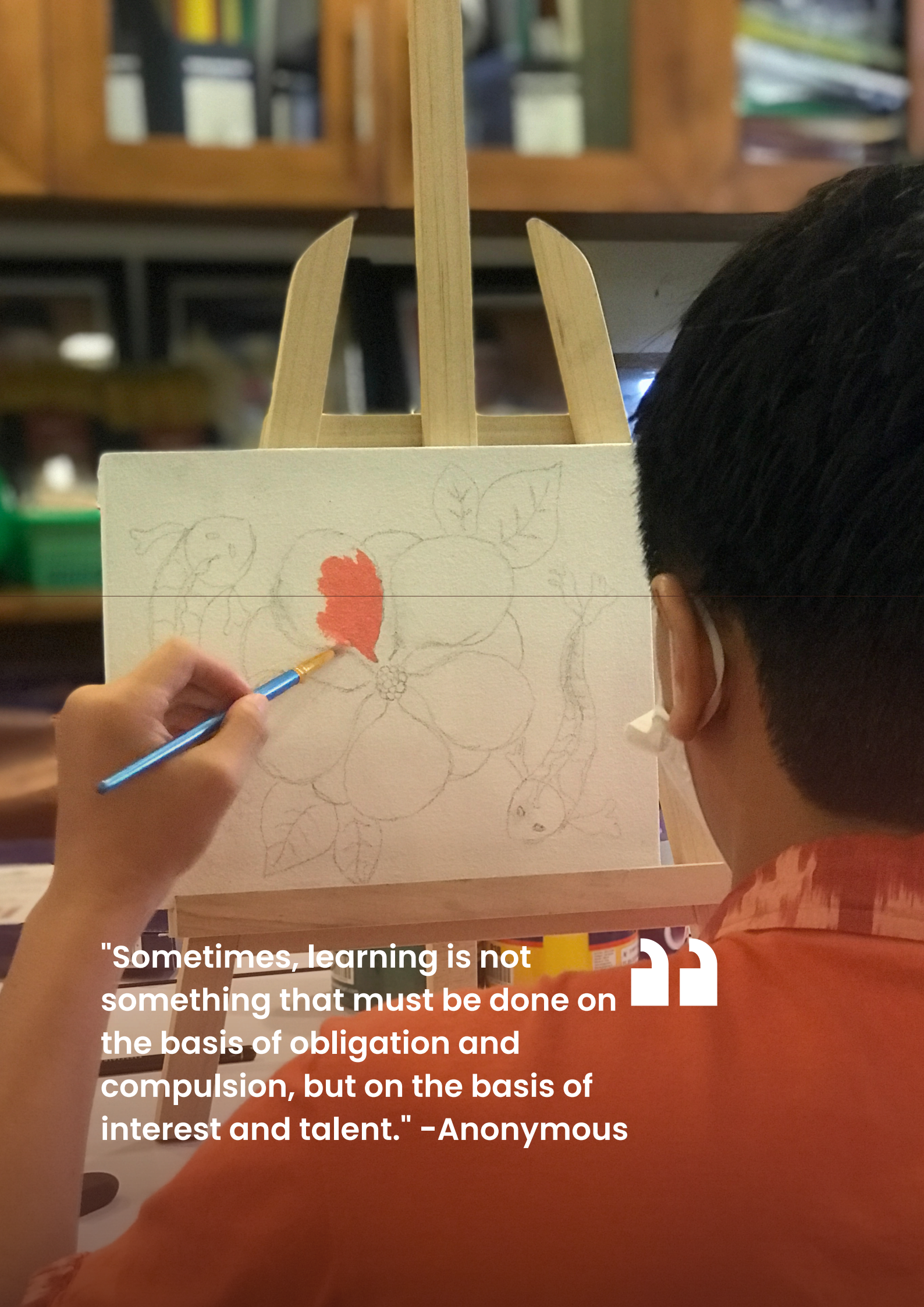
Practice makes Perfect

Kevin (15yo) joined YPK's education class in 2017. He was diagnosed with *Traumatic Brain Injury* which affected the way he walked and required therapy at YPK. Currently, Kevin is able to train and be independent in the gym room with other clients monitored by the YPK team.

Kevin has a shy and reserved personality. This is a challenge for the teacher team to motivate him in learning activities in the classroom so that he can be more active and brave to interact with his friends in class. A few months passed, and Kevin's ability to be interested in art began to be seen. Finally, the team of teachers began to refer Kevin to join the art class in the classroom. In this painting class, Kevin was very quick to understand and respond to the material given by the painting teacher in the class.

The more he was sharpened, Kevin's talent was seen and he began to succeed in painting paintings starting to draw sketches of faces, drawing paintings and some drawings from his imagination that he managed to sell online with the help of his parents. This makes his parents proud, that it turns out that Kevin can be a child who has talent and can even make his own money from his talent.

Home Visit

For people who find it difficult to come to the mobile physiotherapy service post, the YPK team will directly come to the house to provide home services and exercises that can be done by clients at home safely and comfortably.



Primary Health Care

The provision of health services for underprivileged and remote villagers with access to health. The YPK Bali team holds this activity 3 times a year and provides various health checks and treatments.



Early Detection of Growth and Development in Integrated Service Centers

Improving early detection services for growth and development through Posyandu Toddlers in the village to prevent the occurrence of disability rates and more severe ones.

There is a will, there is a way

is an appropriate saying to describe Mr. Ardana.

Mr. Ardana (40th), suffered a stroke on the right side in August. He was treated for 5 days at Buleleng Hospital. A week later after returning from the hospital, Mr. Ardana was visited by the YPK physiotherapist team through a direct visit to his home, because he still had difficulties in carrying out some daily activities, such as moving from bed to seat /wheelchair.



After receiving physiotherapy, Mr. Ardana's condition gradually underwent significant changes. He began to be able to move from the bed to the wheelchair, walking slowly while being stretched. He also tried to practice walking independently, but his right leg was still in a weak condition.

His strong will to heal led him to reach a turning point that was much better than the previous changes. Mr. Ardana's enthusiasm for regularly participating in therapy has yielded results.

In the first 3 months, he was gradually able to walk independently and even Mr. Ardana was also able to ride an electric bicycle. Thanks to his strong enthusiasm and determination to recover, Mr. Ardana is slowly able to return to work as an engineering staff and carry out activities as usual.

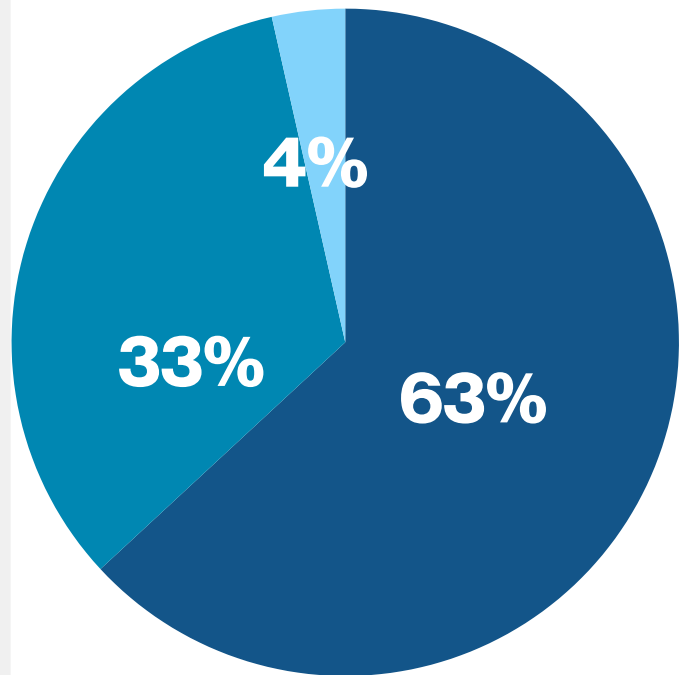

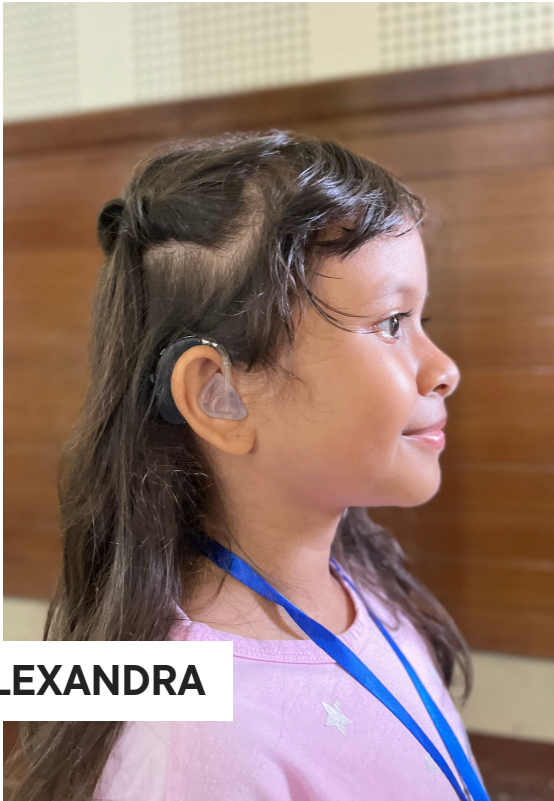
Ear Cerumen

Pie chart description:

- Ear cerumen
- Tonsillitis/ Amandel
- Other case: (hearing loss, Chronic Suppurative Media Otitis, rhinitis)



We have examined 8,181 students at elementary schools in 2024. We successfully tagged 5,000+ (63%) students who had ear cerumen. This identification is very important as a treatment effort from ENT specialists, to be able to follow up through ear cleaning, so that their ears are clean and can hear better and prevent them from experiencing ear infections and damage that can cause deafness.



ALEXANDRA

Alexandra (11 years old) from Denpasar was suffered from hearing loss when she was 3 years old, because a high fever.

Alexandra has a hobby of dancing. She is also one of the students of SLB Negeri 2 Denpasar. Even with her limitations, she can dance well by relying on beats alone to be able to keep up with the music.

Through the BaliRungu program, Alexandra was selected to receive a hearing aid. So now she can hear the music and dance better.

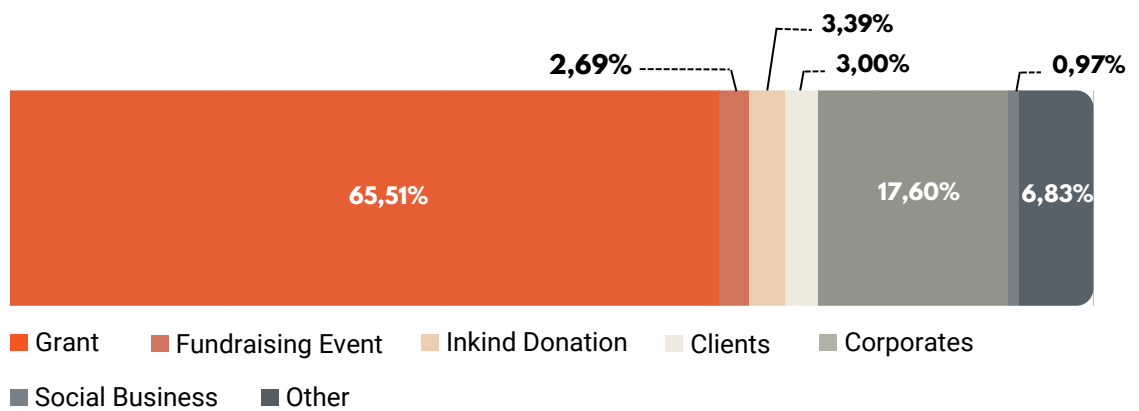
FINN CODY

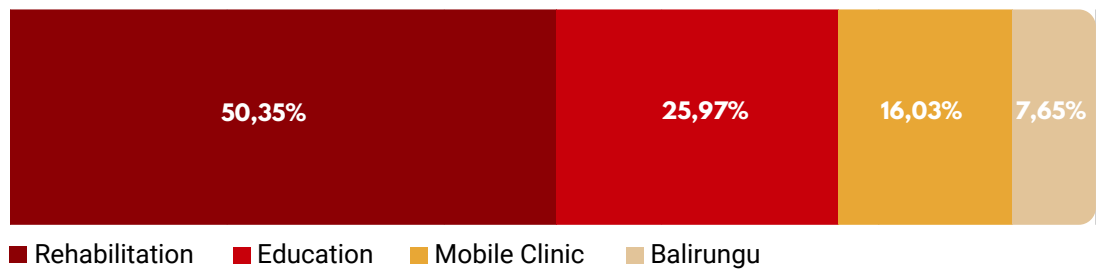

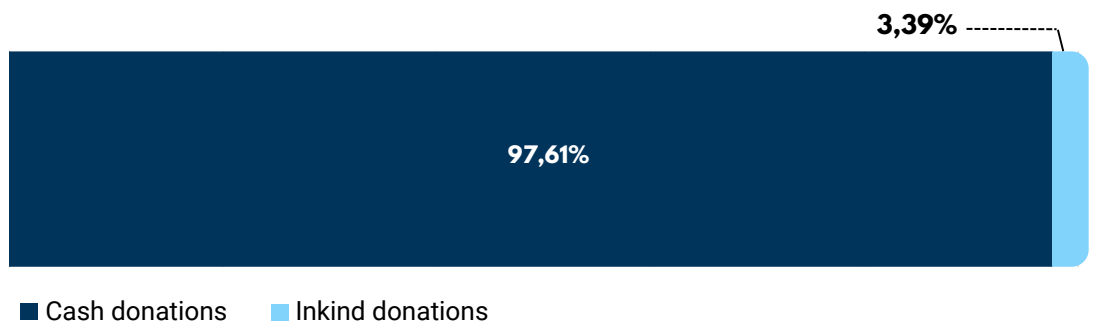
