ACCESS IS CRUCIAL

Access to therapy services is crucial for people with physical disabilities (PWDs). Most families find the cost per individual for therapy sessions too expensive and are unable to afford these long-term costs. The cost per session is \$10.00 USD and those challenged with a physical disability require at least two sessions a week, for at least a year.

COMMITMENT TO CHANGE

YPK Bali is on a mission to change this. Access to quality therapeutic services and other services that aim to increase the quality of life of people with physical disabilities should be available anywhere and at any time. Therefore, it must start with the family. But these changes would not be possible if YPK worked on its mission alone. Who We Are

YPK Bali was founded in 2001 and is a not-for-profit organisation. It aims to assist people with a disability to be independent, improve their health, optimise their abilities, and help them recognise their importance in society.

What We Do

YPK Bali provides integrated programs for people with physical disabilities to improve their health and independence through physical rehabilitation programs, informal education, mobile clinics, and a hearing loss prevention program called BaliRungu.

Where We Work

YPK Bali is located at the Annika Linden Centre in Tophati, Bali, which is a new rehabilitation facility. It is custom-built to cater for local non-profit organisations, which includes YPK and other health disability and organisations. YPK Bali also reaches out to people with physical disabilities throughout Bali through outreach our program.

Director's Note



YPK has with determination and consistency, promoted and provided equal access to health and educational services for people with physical disabilities. This includes access which is our top priority. YPK is now launching and expanding its current services which are - The Putera Desa (Community-based disability centre), an initiative to promote the accessible therapy program at village level, and also the Rumah Bantu Dengar (community hearing centre) which is a project that aims to promote quality health services at a community level. We believe these initiatives are well needed within the communities and equally appreciated by the people in need of these services.

Throughout 2022, YPK has supported 312 people with physical disabilities. This has included more than 193 children under the age of 16. Furthermore, our other very successful initiative, our hearing impairment program has reached and served 8,005 people across Bali. This is where we provide hearing tests and where needed, have provided hearing aids.

However, 2022 also brought our YPK family and friends deep sadness. Our founder and previous director passed away in September 2022. Mr. Purnawan Budisetia was truly an inspirational person to me and to all who knew him. He was not only one of the founders of this amazing organisation, but was my mentor who helped shape the person I am today. Pak Pur worked tirelessly and had unfailing commitment and dedication towards assisting those with a physical disability. Indeed, he was a role model for me and for everyone at YPK. His spirit will always live in our hearts and in the organisation.

As we look ahead, we will continue to grow by scaling up our impact and expanding our partnership. We know that our commitment to creating positive changes continues to require team-work, and your support with your time and resources are valuable.

YPK's future and life changing stories would not be possible without the extraordinary staff, the volunteers, board members, supporters and our community partners.

YPK Bali continued its leadership by appointing a new director, namely Wahyuni Andhitya. This leadership change went through a series of succession processes, beginning in 2015. Ensuring the organization has leaders who understand the organization's programs and values, and maintain the vision and mission, is very important for YPK's sustainability. This transition process was successfully carried out with the support of YPK's Board and our main partner, the Inspirasia Foundation and Annika Linden Centre.

As our current situation begins returning to normal, after the hard times of the pandemic, YPK is using the momentum to support the scaling up of its impact. In 2022, through cross-sector collaboration, we successfully launched three community-based centers. We strengthened community empowerment to ensure the sustainability of this launched project. As many as 25 local volunteers have been trained to provide assistance to persons with disabilities in the community.

YPK also continues to deliver its services in both face-to-face and online formats. Despite the challenges of the current online system, we are including time allocation from parents to assist in the exercises because they are all busy getting back to work, but the flexibility of this online system has assured that people with physical disabilities could continue to maintain their functions and fitness levels. In fact, YPK has planned to strengthen this online system to a better service model so the wider community can access our resources and benefit from our services.

2001-2002

We started YPK Bali in 2001. and then we started the first YPK Bali project in 2002.

Wangga, a 3 year old boy from Denpasar, was one of our clients who joined YPK during the pandemic back in 2021.
Unfortunately, this story is not only about him, but also about his father, Mr. Wahyu. Mr. Wahyu had a stroke after he lost his job at a restaurant due to the pandemic. His situation became more challenging as his little boy, named Wangga, was diagnosed with autism and hydrocephalus.

Both father and son came to YPK for therapy assistance. YPK's physiotherapists introduced local-resource-based therapeutic equipment to Mr. Wahyu and his wife. The idea was to support the family to be able to continue doing all exercises at home using materials they already had. Mr. Wahyu was enthusiastic to learn and gain help for his son, Wangga.

During our home visit, we proudly witnessed Wangga walking with a homemade walker made out of PVC pipe. Additional good news was shared by Mr. Wahyu's wife. She informed us that Mr. Wahyu was now able to ride a motor bike. He continues to practice working on getting his independence back and supporting his family. The positive family bonding and cooperation has truly brought joy to the Mr. Wahyu's entire family as well as the YPK Bali Family.

FAMILY TEAM WORK











The Rehabilitation Center offers clients a multidisciplinary therapy approach, incorporating physiotherapy and occupational therapy. All the support has been delivered in collaboration with each child's parents. From the beginning, each child receives an initial assessment at YPK. Then our team directly starts to work closely with both father and mother of the child. Through this collaboration, YPK staff will be helping the parents to understand the current condition of their child and the challenges and possible solutions. The parents will learn about maximizing local resources to support a therapy program and how they can effectively treat their child. This will help them in providing continued support both at home and in their communities.



SERVICES

218 people with physical disabilities accessed our services every month.



Teaming up with physiotherapists, this program successfully delivered a total of 16,904 therapy sessions for 218 people with physical disabilities. Ninety-four out of 218 were new clients, who joined the rehabilitation program in 2022.



FAMILY SUPPORT

YPK team has continued to work closely with 218 parents and/or family members to provide support for people with physical disabilities.



21 people with physical disabilities were provided with home visit service to support their daily activities and independence.



Early detection and intervention of a disability were provided to 730 babies in collaboration with 5 Public Health Centres around Denpasar City.






I WON'T GIVE UP





It was May 2022 when Mr. Ketut came to YPK for the first time, for help. At that time, he was sitting in a standard type of wheelchair because of his hernia nucleus pulposus. He had lost his job as a driver but he never lost his spirit to want to regain his independence. All the therapeutic plans had been carried out, both at our rehabilitation center and at his house in Gianyar. Then, just in three months, Mr. Ketut was able to stand up on his own with support from a walker. He started to walk and continued to do all his required home exercises.

In September of 2022, Mr. Ketut took his first evaluation process with YPK's physiotherapist. He surprised our therapists and his family by showing that he now was able to use a tripod cane to walk around. Currently, Mr. Ketut comes to YPK on his own and does not require family support. He feels relieved as his family can now get back to their work and that he is no longer an extra burden. His goals are to develop better walking patterns and strengthen his lower limbs. His spirit and optimism are inspirational to us all.


18 new students were welcomed into YPK's Education Program this year. In total, 120 active students attended the program and 11,009 teaching sessions taught.



Program Challenges:

It takes a village to build an engaged community so they are equipped to participate with the program activities from the beginning and in the future. To work on this community engagement, YPK team has been collaborating with local NGOs to empower communities to promote active participation and increase their sense of belonging to the community center.





PUSAT TERAPI DESA

Pusat Terapi Desa or Putera Desa is a community-based disability centre that was piloted to scale up the impact of YPK services as well as an effort to implement the community-based rehabilitation approach and promote social inclusion.

2 COMMUNITY CENTRES IN 2022

Two Putera Desa were launched this year through our strong partnership with local communities, NGOs and donors.

The first centre is located at Sanggulan Village -Tabanan Regency in collaboration with Forum Bhinneka Tunggal Ika. Since its launch in April 2022, the first Putera Desa has supported 19 new clients.

The second Putera Desa was opened in July 2022. This centre was developed through funding support from the Australian Volunteer Program and has been implemented in collaboration with Bumi Sehat Foundation which is based in Gianyar Regency.

To support the sustainability of these centres, training has been provided to local volunteers who have committed and are willing to help an underserved community. In total, 25 local volunteers have been involved to run the centre and 5 sessions of training were delivered to increase their capacity in supporting people with physical disabilities.



MOBILE



86 Families are able to make therapeutic tools using materials that are found around them, to support the exercise and independence of family members with disabilities.

WALKING




Komang was born with down syndrome. Due to his family circumstance, Komang never received any support or treatment to help him catch up on all his growth and development milestones. Through our partnership with Stepping Stones Foundation, Komang, who lives in the northern part of Bali, can now access our services every Monday. His parents are very supportive and are diligently stimulating Komang at home to improve his mobility and functions. Now two years old, Komang can walk. He loves to play and he is unstoppable.


BACK TO SCHOOL



Krisna (16 years old) was in a coma for a month after a tragic motorbike accident. When he recovered from his prolonged loss of consciousness, he realized that his right hand and left leg had weakened. His room at home was the only place he knew since his hospital discharge. He had no friends and spent his time just lying on his bed.

Then in September of 2022 Krisna joined our Mobile Clinic. During our first physical assessment and interview, we could tell that Krisna had the motivation to get his life back. He then undertook all the exercises through the supervision of his parents. Within three months, Krisna was back to school. His mobility had improved and his confidence to meet friends and teachers increased. This brought hope, not just for Krisna to continue his education, but also for his parents to see their son achieve a brighter future.







RUMAH BANTU DENGAR

Rumah Bantu Dengar (RBD) Community Hearing Center is initiative that aims to promote early detection and intervention of hearing loss. It was developed through funding support from the Australian Aid - the Direct Aid Program and supported by Government the of Denpasar Municipality by providing space and operational cost (water and electricity).












Located at the Denpasar Disability Service Center, RBD was launched in July 2022. Since its inception, this centre was helped **530** people to access quality hearing tests and medical treatment. We're also thrilled to work with **3** doctor volunteers in delivering the service. Now, this centre is open twice a week and an appointment is required.

CASE REPORT



Over the past five years, the YPK Bali team reached 252 locations across Bali that had been flagged as having no access to Ear, Nose and Throat (ENT) services.

We examined 38,289 people and 26,581 were children. Through these examinations, we were able to flag 10,222 children who had developed cerumen (ear wax). Identification is essential for treatment from the ENT specialist doctor, so that they can have clean ear canals allowing them to hear better and prevent them from developing ear infections and damage that can cause deafness.




